A TALE OF TWO KITTIES (AND OTHER ANIMAL STORIES)

Oasis volunteers got to experience the birth of two sets of kittens in March. **Bianca** is a gorgeously marked, petite calico who came from a feral colony that Oasis has been helping to get under control, thru our Sterilization Assistance Program. The caregiver finally caught the prolific female of the group, only to discover when she was brought to the vet to be spayed that she was due any day for kittens! Since the caregiver had no room for the mama-to-be, Oasis took her in. Another mama cat was brought in a week later; this pretty little tuxedo cat was abandoned by her family when they moved away. Oasis named her **Gypsy**. Bianca had her 5 babies on March 16th; Gypsy had her 5 babies on March 20th! Sadly, one of Gypsy's babies passed away on March 23rd. Both mamas and the other 9 babies are doing well, and may be ready for their new adoptive homes mid-June.

A local woman found a very friendly chicken wandering in her backyard. After trying unsuccessfully to find the bird's home, she finally called Oasis and asked that **Esmeralda** (as she named her), come live at Oasis because the hen was not doing well as an "only bird". We added Esmeralda to our little brood of chickens and she fit right in. And she lays an egg every day!

Oasis received a call just after Christmas from a man who scooped up a little kitten walking blindly down the Black Horse Pike in Williamstown, NJ. The 6 week old baby's eyes were shut tight from infection and she had no idea of the imminent danger around her. He brought her to Oasis and we took her to the vet immediately. Her eyes were so infected with a herpes virus that she had ulcers in both eyes. Her left eye was so badly infected that one of her eyelids was stuck to her eyeball! This little one was in a lot of pain. Two surgeries and LOTS of medications brought the infection mostly under control. She can see now, although the left eye is still not clear, and may never be 100% normal. She is still on different medications to clear up the infection and reduce the pain in that eye. This little black cat LOVES to play with her toys and is a little spitfire in her playpen! We named her **Chrissie**, after the kind man who stopped to save her.

Our darling donkey **Molly** had a bad month – she foundered in both front feet and was in terrible pain. She would neither stand nor eat. She was quarantined to a barn stall with both feet wrapped with soft cushions. X-rays showed the vet exactly what was wrong, and she was immediately put on medication for Equine Metabolic Syndrome (similar to diabetes in humans). Molly is doing much better now. Thankfully, subsequent x-rays show no additional injury to her hooves' inner structures, altho the damage done cannot be reversed. She also needs to have her hooves trimmed every 3 weeks instead of 6.

This past winter we were finding an unusual number of stray and feral cats on the property. We caught two males, **Champ** and **Ollie**, and saw that a third cat had a tipped ear so we knew she (?) was sterilized. Champ is a HUGE male cat, about 3 years old and just so cute with his little cauliflower ear (hence the name "Champ"!). He has become very docile and loving since he was neutered; he CRAVES attention and is up for adoption. We needed to have a sizeable enclosure built in the kitchen of the farmhouse for Champ, as he is simply too big for our cage condos. Ollie was recently vetted and neutered; he is taking a much slower time getting socialized but we are seeing progress every day. He has the most uniquely colored eyes – they are TEAL, and beautifully complement his white and black fur.

Sadly, our beloved **Monty** was humanely euthanized on February 13th. He started having seizures, struggled terribly to breathe, and the vet mentioned he may have had a stroke. (Co-founder) Phyllis and (farmhand) Russell stayed with him during the cold, blustery snowstorm until the vet was able to arrive. His companion Tinkerbell (a/k/a Pony) sadly watched the ordeal from close by.

As you can see, every day is an adventure at Oasis – and an expensive one at that!! At Oasis, it is always about the well-being of our residents. (TAX DEDUCTIBLE) DONATIONS ARE URGENTLY NEEDED AND GRATEFULLY ACCEPTED FOR ALL OF OUR RESIDENTS' NEEDS.

Since Oasis is not taking in any dogs at this time, we have partnered with 2 other animal welfare agencies to help rehome their dogs: the Atlantic County Animal Shelter 609: the Atlantic County Animal Shelter 609: 485-2345 and the Safe at Home Rescue safeathomerescue.org. Safe at Home Rescue is a small dog rescue that gets animals from puppy mills in PA and OH. The dogs are vetted, sterilized and socialized before being adopted.
