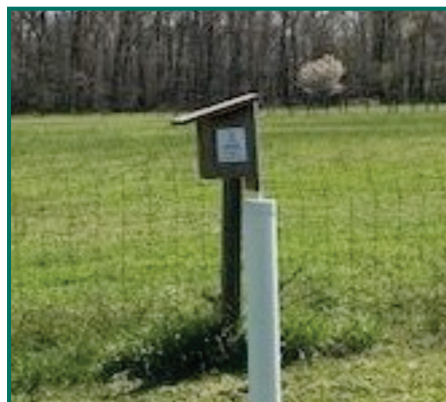

Our Blue Bird House with 4 Babies

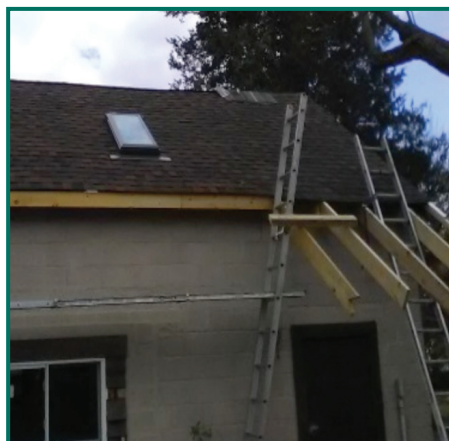
CAT COTTAGE UPDATE

Work on the roof was slow and difficult, mostly due to the nasty weather; however, this phase is finally almost completed, and a new contractor will be focusing on constructing the outside staircase and front door vestibule soon.

We have received encouraging news that the County will accept the cottage being tied in with the existing septic system so a new system does not have to be installed. This does, however, require some simple renovations to be made in the farmhouse. **It's always SOMETHING!**

We have also been working on converting the cottage from propane to natural gas. The conversion should be low cost, and the cottage can then be tied into the new generator system we are having installed. This eliminates the necessity of having 2 separate generators.

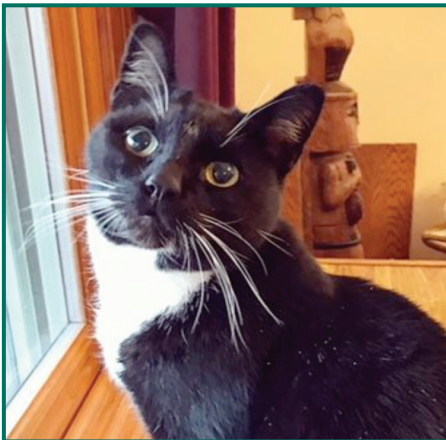

- when someone is having a bad day, be silent, sit close by, and nuzzle them gently.

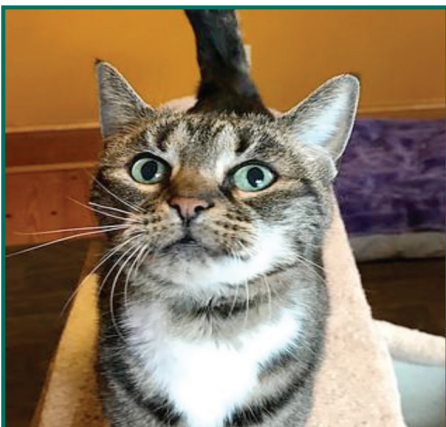
ADORABLE ADOPTABLES - WE WANT TO GO HOME!

Andre (M)

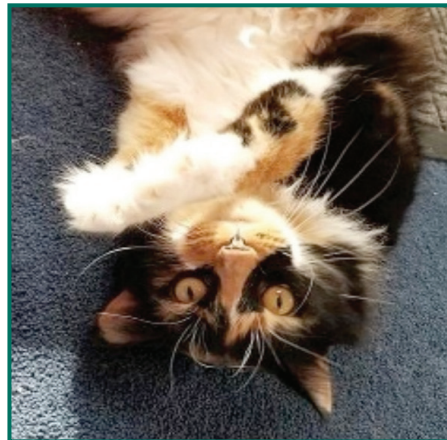
Found as a stray in Franklinville, this large and very friendly male cat will steal your heart with his happy, playful self. **Andre** is neutered and up to date on shots. He would most likely prefer being an "only cat", so he doesn't have to share his loving person with anyone else. We believe he is 2 - 3 years old.

Look at these beautiful green eyes! **Sassy** is a friendly and independent kitty looking for a new home where she will be loved forever. Hugo is a stunning thoroughbred gelding who was surrendered to Oasis in August 2016. Hugo was a race horse and suffered a career-ending injury to his right front leg. He was literally days away from being euthanized because he could no longer race (read: "earn money"). Hugo has a heart as big as his body and is a nice animal to work around; he is considered the "gentle giant" of the farm. He has very nice ground manners and enjoys being in

his field. He walks well most days but we have observed him to limp at the trot. We are able to manage his discomfort with supplements and medication when needed. At this time, we are only considering him to be available for adoption as a pasture pal.



Gulliver (M)

Gulliver, now a 9 year old Haflinger / grade gelding, was originally surrendered to Oasis when the organization purchased their farm in Franklinville. The former caregivers moved to another part of the country and did not take Gulliver. We were told he was trained to drive but does not like a saddle on him. He had some groundwork training with a professional horse trainer and also had an advanced rider working with him under saddle. He is a high energy animal that needs consistent training and attention. Gulliver is active and enjoys being with other horses. He needs a job!! Because of his energy level, only advanced riders would be considered as potential adopters.



Junior (M)

This adorable 19 year old Welsh Cobb pony, **Junior**, came from a farm where he gave rides to children, but can no longer work for a living. He has a very sweet personality and is calm and "even -tempered", even around strangers. He is definitely a "little guy with a big heart"!

Two No-Cost Programs for the Animals

Amazon has a "Smile" program where they donate a portion of your sale to a charity of your choice.
